GATHERING

LEADER: YOU WHO DWELL IN THE SHELTER OF THE MOST HIGH, WHO ABIDE IN THE SHADOW OF THE ALMIGHTY – SAY TO THE LORD:

My refuge and my fortress; my God, in whom I trust!

For it is He who delivers you from the snare of the trapper, and from the deadly pestilence.

He will cover you with His pinions, and under His wings you will find refuge.

His faithfulness is a shield and bulwark.

You will not fear the terror of the night, nor the arrow that flies by day, Nor the pestilence that stalks in the darkness, nor the destruction that lays waste at noon.

For He will give His angels charge concerning you, to guard you in all your ways.

They will bear you up in their hands, lest you strike your foot against a stone.

When you call on Him, He will answer.

He will be with you in trouble; He will rescue you and honor you and you will see His salvation.

A thought about worship from the Ancient Fathers -

"Solomon says, 'Trust in the Lord with all thine heart, and lean not upon thine own understanding: in all thy ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct thy paths.' Understand what He says: we must not trust in our wisdom, but in the Lord alone. For He directs a person's steps. We are also called to show Him our ways, to reveal our plans to Him. For they aren't made straight by our own work, but by His assistance and mercy. It is written, 'Make my way right before Thy face.' Then what is right to You will also seem also right to me. Solomon says the same thing: 'Commit thy works unto the Lord, and thy thoughts shall be established.' Therefore, thoughts are carried out when we commit everything we do to the Lord our Helper, resting our works on the firm and solid rock, and attributing everything to Him."
