A thought about worship from the Ancient Fathers -

"We should bring sacrifices to God through our words since God said He is the Word. Therefore the supreme act of worshiping God is praise toward Him from the mouth of a righteous person. However, to be accepted by God, there must be humility, fear, and devotion to the greatest degree. If people place confidence in their own integrity and innocence, they will be charged with pride and arrogance and lose the reward of their morality. But in order to obtain God's favor and be freed from every stain, always beg for God's mercy. Pray for nothing other than pardon for your sins, even if you don't have any. If you want anything else, there is no need to express it in words to the One who knows what we wish. If anything good happens to you, give thanks. If any evil, make amends and confess that the evil has happened to you because of your own faults. Even in evils give thanks and make amends in good times, so that you can be the same at all times. Be firm, unchangeable, and unshaken. Don't suppose that these things are to be done only in the temple, but at home, and even in your bed. In short, always have God with you and devote your heart to Him since you are a temple of God."
