The Lord's Prayer

Passing of the Peace

Leader: May the peace of the Father hold you,
the friendship of Christ encircle you,
and the fire of the Spirit make you warm to the stranger.

My brothers and sisters,
the peace of God be with you.

ALL: And also with you.

Communion

Leader: The Lord is here.

ALL: God's Spirit is with us.

Leader: Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Leader: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

Leader: Praise be to you, our Father, for Your Son Jesus Christ.
He lived and died for love for us, and, after rising from the
dead, yet more wonderfully met with His disciples.

He walked with them, taught them and shared supper with
them. He ascended into heaven and through the power of
the Holy Spirit He is with us now.

Therefore we join the saints and angels echoing Your
praise throughout the world and saying:

**ALL: Holy, Holy, Holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of Your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.**

Leader: Praise and thanks to You, Father in heaven, for on the
night on which he was betrayed, Your Son Jesus Christ
took bread and gave thanks, He broke it and gave it to His
disciples, saying, "Take, eat, this is my body, given for you.
Do this in remembrance of me."

Taking the cup of wine, he said, "This is my Blood shed
for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this
as often as you drink it in remembrance of me."

(Turn right away >>)

Leader: Great is the mystery of faith:

**ALL: Christ has died,
Christ has risen,
Christ will come again.**

Leader: As we remember His death on the cross, His sacrifice made once for all to save us, we rejoice in His living presence.

Send Your Holy Spirit, that the bread that we break and cup that we bless may be to us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Unite us with Him and with all God's people in heaven and earth.

Every time we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until He comes again.

If you are thirsty, drink the Fount of Life. If you are hungry, eat the Bread of Life. Blessed are all who hunger for this Bread and thirst for this Fount.

Communion is shared.

Prayer after Communion

**ALL: Almighty God,
from whose love nothing can part us,
I thank You for this bread of life, my God.
I am a traveler and stranger in the world,
like so many of Your people before me.**

**I trust it is Your voice I hear,
the call of the Spirit,
the cry of the Bird of Heaven.**

**I offer You my "yes" to risky living....
The sea takes me;
where I do not know,
but I gladly go.**

(The liturgy concludes >>)

Blessing

Leader: When you no longer know how to be,
may the Father take you on your deeper journey.
When you no longer know what to do,
may the Spirit reveal to you your fitting task.
When all feels lost or foreign,
may you know your home in Christ.

On the path that is before you,
may you have compassion for the journey,
may you find Christ in the stranger,
and may you know the love and blessing of God.

**ALL: +In the name of the Father,
and of the Son,
and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.**

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About the “Small Boat, Great Big Sea Communion” Liturgy:

This communion liturgy was inspired by the story of St. Brendan, a saint who made a physical journey out into the vast wilderness of the ocean with a small boat and a simple prayer, “Christ of the mysteries, can I trust you on the sea?” As Brendan and his companions battled with wave and tide, answering their call to risky living, Brendan explored a deep and challenging inner journey and discovered a profound truth: no matter how foreign a place or situation was, he was always “at home” because he had his home in Christ. As we share communion together in this Brendan-inspired liturgy, may we know something more of this home that we share.
