**for He is holy!**





**We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic church.**


**We affirm one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.**

In Your mercy, forgive us, we pray.


**We long only to live in Your light and walk in Your ways,**

*Be Thou My Vision*


Be Thou my vision, O Lord of my heart.




