He sits on His holy throne.

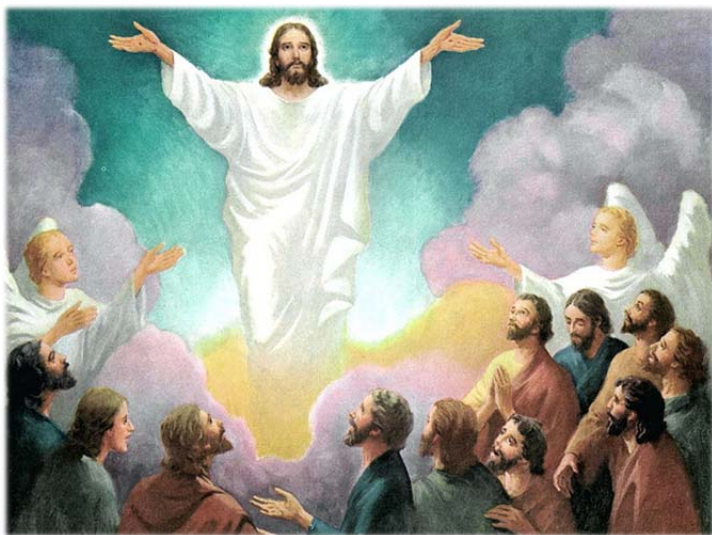
God has gone up with a shout,

but also in the age to come.**
