PROFESSION OF FAITH

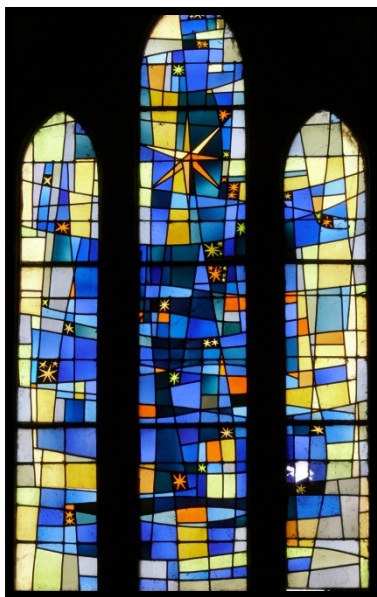
What Child is This?
