I will sing praise to my God while I have my being.

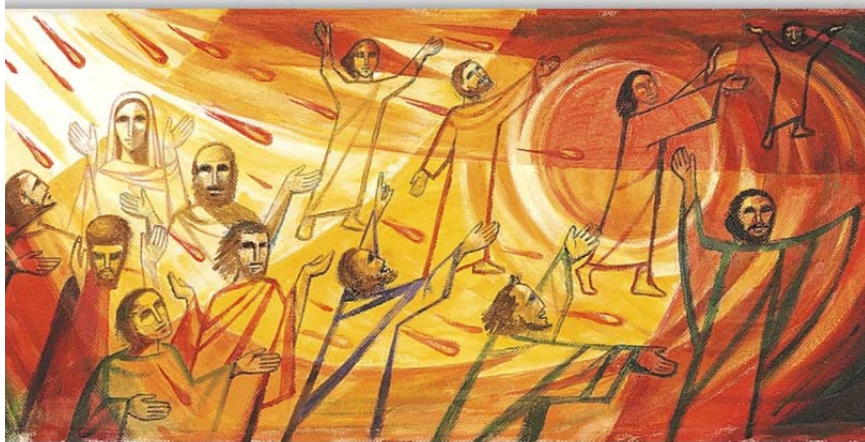
May our meditation be pleasing to Him,

PROFESSION OF FAITH

Let us express our unity with the church of all ages on this Pentecost Sunday by professing our faith in the words of the Heidelberg Catechism:

In his divinity, majesty, grace, and Spirit, Christ is not absent from us for a moment.

By the Spirit's power we make the goal of our lives not earthly things, but the things above, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand.

Through the Holy Spirit, Christ pours out his gifts from heaven upon us his members.

The Spirit, as well as the Father and the Son, is eternal God.

The Spirit has been given to us personally, so that by true faith the Spirit makes us share in Christ and all his blessings, comforts us, and remains with us forever.

PRAYERS OF CONFESSION

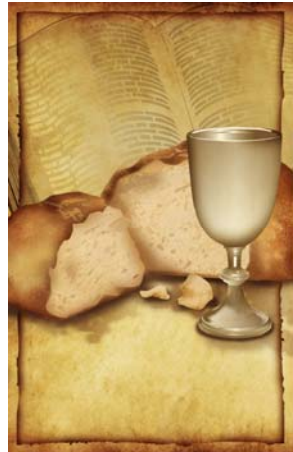

In approximately six months the church has been carried through all the saving events of God—his incarnation, manifestation to the world, life, death, resurrection, and ascension as well as the coming of the Holy Spirit. All these crucial events form faith and the spiritual life. . . . Broadly speaking, Pentecost brings understanding to the followers of Jesus, empowers them in ministry, establishes the church, and points to the end of history when the kingdom of Christ will be established over all the earth.” Robert E.
