A thought about worship from the Ancient Fathers -

"The people were released from Egypt by a strong hand and an outstretched arm. This wasn't the hand of Moses and Aaron, but of God, who set them free by signs and wonders and by destroying the firstborn of Egypt. As a result, those who were at first persistent in keeping the people eagerly urged them to leave at last. Solomon says, 'Trust in the Lord with all thine heart, and lean not upon thine own understanding: in all thy ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct thy paths.' Understand what He says: we must not trust in our wisdom, but in the Lord alone. For He directs a person's steps. We are also called to show Him our ways, to reveal our plans to Him. For they aren't made straight by our own work, but by His assistance and mercy. It is written, 'Make my way right before Thy face.' Then what is right to You will also seem also right to me. Solomon says the same thing: 'Commit thy works unto the Lord, and thy thoughts shall be established.' Therefore, thoughts are carried out when we commit everything we do to the Lord our Helper, resting our works on the firm and solid rock, and attributing everything to Him."
