A thought about worship from the Ancient Fathers -

Now we all know, now we don't know; now we rejoice, now we don't rejoice—in order to begin, continue, and complete our good work. Then we will understand that our knowledge and joy aren't a result of our own wills, but are gifts of God. We will be cured of our vanity and understand the spiritual truth that 'The Lord will give kindness and sweet grace, and our land shall yield her fruit." — Augustine
